

REPORT OF POLISH COORDINATOR

From 25th to 29th September 2017 the Salesian School hosted the international meeting of the Erasmus + project: "The trail of extinct and active volcanoes, earthquakes across Europe." The school was visited by 40 students, 12 teachers from Turkey, Portugal (Azores), Spain (Canary Islands), Italy and France. The

students were hosted in the houses of students from Poland. On the first day of the project, the guests were welcomed by the headmaster Jerzy Babiak, a ceremony took place at the school with the participation of television and journalists. All participants watched presentations and movies on the impact of tourism on volcanoes. It was product done during work on the project.

During the stay, the guests were privileged to have a meeting with the vice-president of Wroclaw. Participants under the direction of the guide went to the extinct Volcanic Shale volcano, a coneshaped hill. The elevation of steep slopes, with a clearly underlined summit, rises alone in the central-western part of the Ostrzyckie Upland, clearly distinguishing itself from the flat landscape. Elevation of diverse geological structure, made of Miocene volcanoes forming part of the core of the former volcanic volcano filled with lava and lava cover with alkaline lava. It is built of basaltite, a rock similar to basalt. It is a volcanic rock, dark, almost black, with a texture of afanite or porphyry.

Visiting the Land of Extinct Volcanoes, the students took part in workshops at the Sudeten Educational Center (*sudeckazagroda.pl*), where they learned about the construction of volcanoes, the types of volcanoes, the earthquakes simulator, and acquainted with the collection of rocks and minerals, culture of the region.Participants in the meeting also participated in the rafting and admired the animals in Afrycarium.

The school invited Polish traveler, mountaineer and volcano guru Grzegorz Gawlik who participated in the program: *100 Volcanoes*. (www.grzegorzgawlik.pl).

He travelled around 100 countries on 6 continents. He presented to the participants of the program many of the world's volcanoes on the amazing photos.

During the meeting, the teachers made important decisions on collegiate meetings. They determined that at a meeting in France there would be a drama related to culture, the beliefs associated with volcanism. The coordinator of the project asked for an evaluation questionnaire after the meeting.
